Economy: Sierra Leone is an extremely poor country. Nearly half of the working-age population engages in subsistence agriculture. The country has rich resources: rutile, diamonds, bauxite, iron ore, oil, agriculture and fishery. However, the country is still recovering from a civil war that ended in 2002 and destroyed most institutions. In recent years, economic growth has been driven by mining, particularly iron ore and oil exploration.

Government: Constitutional Democracy

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Brief Political History: Sierra Leone has special significance in the history of the trans-Atlantic slave trade as it was the departure point for thousands of west African captives. Democracy is slowly being reestablished after the civil war from1991 to 2002 that resulted in the deaths of about a third of the population. The military took over security following departure of the UN peacekeepers, and continues to maintain the country's stability, although the UN Integrated Peacekeeping Office maintained a staff of 122 until 2014. The government's priorities include furthering development, creating jobs, and stamping out endemic corruption.

Challenges:

Sierra Leone was the first West African country to be evangelized. The first Protestant Church was started in Freetown, among freed slaves, in 1785.

Yet, after over 200 years only 10% of the country claim to be Christian. The newer, more dynamic groups tend to be spiritually shallow and overly focused on prosperity teaching and miracles.

Pray for churches that balance the Word and the Spirit for a deep desire to reach out in loving witness to the non-Christian majority. Pray for the Holy Spirit to gift and empower many churches to minister to humanitarian needs. Pray for forgiveness and healing for the many who committed

or endured atrocities including orphans, those forced

to be child soldiers or slaves of rebels, victims of amputation, mutilation or rape, and mental trauma. **Pray** as you are led. Consider praying for sustainable

economic growth, wise governance, and practical solutions that can be implemented effectively.
